#### **MAYOR'S MINUTE**

Publication started for bids on the water meter replacement project, bid openings are scheduled on May 8, 2024. The SLIB board approved our formal request to reduce the interest rate on the water meter loan and extend the completion/forgiveness deadline. I attended the week-long grant writing and Federal Funding Summit sponsored by the Governor's office and Senators Barasso and Lummis. Many contacts were made for funding opportunities, and we received offers for grant writing assistance to help Hudson pay for our flood mitigation, sewer infrastructure, and economic development projects which includes the baseball field, Svilar Park, and Main Street traffic projects to name a few. Franks Meats annexation agreement will be finalized. The floor warranty claim is scheduled for assessment this Friday. Svilar Park and Gold Star Memorial Park cleanup in preparation of Hudson Daze continue. The Lander and Riverton Rotary Clubs have offered do a service project to help with the Ballpark revitalization., The local Girl Scouts, will help with painting at Gold Star Memorial Park and the VFW is helping as well. The Wyoming DEQ SPURR (Brownsfield) Project will be offering a presentation at the May 14 town council meeting to offer 100% free assistance to property owners to assess Main Street building conditions and preservation. Town Code Enforcement is working, and I am working to get roll-off containers from Hopper Disposal for a Town Cleanup week during the last full week of May. A proposed modified dog ordinance is drafted, and the town council is reviewing the proposed wording prior to the town holding a public meeting in May. Work has begun on Town Policy and Procedure Manuals and pursuing a new "Master Plan" document for the Town. Mayor Sherry Oler

REMINDERS: *Please be considerate - clean up after your dogs, both in your yard and in public spaces. M*ake sure your dog is contained/restrained at all times. All dogs require registration/licenses that can be obtained at Town Hall; **please bring proof of vaccination**. All cats (plus chickens, goats, and other animals) need to be registered. Registered at Town Hall during business hours Animals not registered will be impounded. A big "thank you" to the Mayor & Council for enforcing the Parking Ordinance. Please keep our streets free of vehicles and, per town ordinances, all residents and owners must keep all properties clean, safe and maintained. As you embark on Spring Cleaning, please take advantage of Spring Clean-Up Days; do not leave debris onto the streets or right-of-way. THANK YOU!

<u>WATER HYDRANT FLUSHING</u>: The water system and hydrants will be flushed during the first two weeks of May and during this process you may experience periods of low water pressure.

<u>WATER METER ACCESS:</u> - Property owners are responsible to make sure their water meter is accessible. Inaccessible meters have been estimated in the past due to no access. Per Ordinance, the **OWNER** of the property is responsible and may be charged an <u>ADDITIONAL \$40 FEE</u> if your meter is unreadable/ inaccessible.



Auto Pay for your water/sewer bill: Did you know you can now pay your utility bill by text? Auto pay is also available. Your bill will be paid timely, on a specific day of the month. No more writing a check or stopping by Town Hall to pay before the 20th. If you don't want to use auto pay, you can still sign up to use xpressbillpay and pay online at your convenience. It's free to sign up and free to use!

**DROP BOX:** Conveniently located on the right side of the Town Hall front door for payments and checked daily.

<u>PERMITS:</u> There are Town Ordinances regarding mobile homes, buildings, fences, etc., so please make sure to read and check on building permits, mobile home/trailer permits, or home improvements, etc. You can find the Town Ordinances on our website under the government tab.
